Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Ventura ES serves 573 students enrolled in grades Kindergarten through fifth. The student population's ethnicity is made of 74% Hispanic and 26% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 72% White, 22% Black, 1% Native, 1% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 5% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Ana Gonzalez and Assistant Principal Ranita Brown. Ventura ES is proud to offer many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include Music, Yearbook, Art, Running, Patrols, Chess, Violin, Reader's Theatre, OPD Kids and Battle of the Books Clubs, VPK/VPK VE, as well as Dual-Language for grades K-3.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Ventura ES indicates that the average age of the collection is 2009 and the number of books per student is 18. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection.

At this time, Ventura ES does meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Students at this school have shown tremendous improvement on state ELA examinations, though math has shown a decline. This noted, less than half of the student body has reached proficiency on any state examination.
- This school has a Hispanic population of 74% but only 1.9% of the media collection are Spanish titles and 1.7% of books contain spanish authors, themes or characters. Research and ordering of titles within these categories that accurately depict Hispanic culture, history and stories would benefit Ventura greatly.
- The nonfiction collection at Ventura Elementary, though large, is dated far beyond best practice's recommendation of five years. Targeted weeding of titles under the technology, science, history and computer science categories, as well as intentional ordering, is a necessity.

- Black students are 22% of the school's population. However, we only have 2.3% of titles
 written by black authors and or otherwise depicting black culture, history and stories.
 Purchases of new titles will focus on increasing these numbers to better reflect our school
 community.
- In addition to the physical media center collection, the district provides almost 5,000 eBooks, audiobooks and digital magazines.

Comparison between 2021-22 and 2022-23 Testing Data

(adapted from https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/results/2023.stml) In 2023, the state transitioned from Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) to Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. The 2022-23 for FAST and Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are based on **provisional** achievement level cuts that are linked to each assessment's respective 2021-22 reporting scale. Comparisons should not be made between the 2023 data and previous years' data. The implementation of FAST K-2 in the 2022-23 school year was the first administration of statewide assessments for students in grades K-2. These assessments include Star Early Literacy Proficiency, Star Reading Proficiency, and Star Math Proficiency

Collection Analysis

The collection is developed for and influenced by students, their interests, academic needs and alignment to the curriculum. The data below is a snapshot of the collection based on a Titlewise Analysis from July 2023. Purchasing or weeding after that time is not reflected in this data.

Notes

- At Ventura, the technology books are, on average, fourteen years old, computer science nine, science thirteen and history fifteen. While this may appear relatively new, the information in these books statistically, age out after 5 years.
- This school's most current section of books is still aged by a minimum of eight years.
- Arts and recreation is a highly circulated section but contains very few titles
